

## Abdominal Pain

### \* Oral + IV Contrast

Obstruction  
Diverticulitis  
Thin Patient with RLQ Pain  
Female Patient with Abdomen Pain

### IV Contrast and NO ORAL Contrast

Perirectal Abscess  
Trauma  
AAA

### Oral Contrast and NO IV Contrast

Contraindications to IV Contrast or Refusal of IV Contrast

### NO IV and NO Oral Contrast

? Acute Appendicitis with Very High Clinical Suspicion in Young Males  
RLQ Pain greater than 10% over Ideal BMI Excluding Females  
Renal Stones  
Ventral or Inguinal Hernia

\*If Patient is Vomiting Contrast or Cannot tolerate Contrast after 60 Minutes the patient will be scanned immediately  
Appendicitis Catscan will be done 60 minutes after contrast is started in patient (AKA when they start to drink)  
Diverticulitis Catscan will be done 90 minutes after contrast is started in patients  
(AKA when the patient starts to drink the oral contrast)

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
